Sacred Geometry, Healing, and the Mystic Spiral: This is an experiential HMD, in which we will explore how Sacred Geometry shows up in the physical body and in the Human Energy Field. We will look at ways to use sacred geometrical forms to deepen your healing practice. We will play with Sacred Spinning and Hooping to experience the ways that we can access the flow within the structure of the sacred geometric forms. We will also include a Merkaba Meditation to expand the field of the Heart.
